1 Peter 3:18, 2 Corinthians 5:21

It is better to suffer for doing good because God has <u>commended</u> others for doing the <u>same</u>.

1 Peter 3:20





Noah's Example shows us:

- Following God is not <u>results based</u>, but about faithfulness.
 - 2 Peter 2:5: 5

• Suffering for doing good is honored by God.

Hebrews 11:7

- God is <u>able</u> to <u>save</u> us.
 - 2 Peter 2:4-9

Suffering for doing good <u>agrees</u> with your <u>baptism</u>.

1 Peter 3:21

Baptism is symbolic, not salvific.

Baptism is a public <u>pledge</u> to future <u>faithfulness</u> to Christ.

In a passage that feels obscure we find reassurance that we are blessed to suffer for doing good because it aligns with Christ's <u>example</u>, the <u>winning</u> side, the way God has worked in the <u>past</u>, and your public declaration of baptism.
