The "fear of the Lord" can be understood as "shrinking back in <u>fear</u> and yet drawing close in <u>awe</u>".

1 Peter 1:18-19

The Greek word translated as "redeemed" means "a ransom, to restore 'something back, into the possession of its <u>rightful</u> owner'".

Romans 5:12, Colossians 1:13-14, 1 Timothy 2:5-6, Hebrews 9:15



God <u>rescued</u> us from meaningless lives that were consumed w/meaningless things to now have <u>purpose</u> and direction that is, first of all, concerned with how to please Him and secondly, how to bless and benefit others.

3. Jesus' life, death and resurrection lead us to <u>believe</u> in God.

1 Peter 1:20-21

We have a belief in God that is rooted in <u>reality</u> – in real things that happened that real people, led by God's Spirit, communicated to us that we might have substance to our belief, a weight that rests upon <u>truth</u> and not merely "sincerity".





1 Corinthians 15:3-8, Acts 1:7-11

Note how often these terms of "<u>faith</u>" and "<u>hope</u>" have been mentioned in this first chapter alone – these are essential qualities and responses that are required for us "foreigners" while we live in this strange land, awaiting when we get to "go home".
