

Come Let Us Adore Him Todd Arnett December 9th + 10th, 2023

1. Adoring Jesus is both an invitation and a pursuit.

Matthew 2:1-6, Daniel 7:13-14

<u>Adore</u> – literally "to call out;" "to worship, pay divine honors to, bow down before".

Seekers <u>pursue</u> the God who has been inviting them into relationship with Him; observers merely gather <u>information</u> about Him.



2. Adoring Jesus disrupts our normal preoccupations in order to <u>actively appreciate</u> Him.
Matthew 2:7-12
Advent is not about merely <u>acknowledging</u> Jesus, but <u>adoring</u> Him.
Matthew 22:37-38
"When was the last time that you <u>adored</u> someone or something?"

Consider some of the aspects of what "adoring"	' looks
like in most cases:	

-Deep desire to be near that someone or something.

-A **compelling admiration** or appreciation of that someone or something.

-An **intense sense of value** that you ascribe to that someone or something.

-The ways that you will **change and modify other commitments or relationships** in order to prioritize that someone or something.





-The ways that you **willingly communicate your devotion** and interest about that someone or something.

3. Adoring Jesus rightfully as the <u>Messiah</u> means that adoring anyone/anything to His equal is <u>idolatry</u>.

Colossians 1:15-18

Maybe what is most needed for you to "adore Jesus" this Christmas season begins with the <u>rooting</u> out of <u>rivals</u> that you've allowed to have as much or more priority in your life as your Savior.

"Who or what in my life do I prioritize and adore more than I do Jesus, my Savior?"
